The Secretariat of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) presents its compliments to the IAEA's Member States and has the honour to draw their attention to the **Workshop to Exchange Experience on Energy System Modelling for Planning** (hereinafter referred to as "event") to be held in Zagreb, Croatia, from 29 June to 3 July 2020.

The purpose of the event is to facilitate the exchange of experience among Member States regarding the use of the IAEA's tools for energy planning and analysis.

The attached Information Sheet provides further details of the event.

The event will be held in English.

Member States are invited to designate one participant to represent the Government at this event. Member States are strongly encouraged to identify suitable women participants.

The IAEA is generally not in a position to bear the travel and other costs of participants in the event. The IAEA has, however, limited funds at its disposal to help meet the cost of attendance of certain participants. Upon specific request, such assistance may be offered to normally one participant per country, provided that, in the IAEA's view, the participant will make an important contribution to the event. The application for financial support should be made at the time of designating the participants using the attached Grant Application Form (Form C).

It should be noted that compensation is not payable by the IAEA for any damage to or loss of personal property. The IAEA also does not provide health insurance coverage for participants in IAEA events. Arrangements for private insurance coverage on an individual basis should therefore be made. The IAEA will, however, provide insurance coverage for accidents and illnesses that clearly result from any work performed for the IAEA.

Designations should be submitted to the IAEA through the competent national authority (Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) not later than 30 April 2020 using the attached Participation Form (Form A). Completed and authorized Participation Forms should be sent either by email to: Official.Mail@iaea.org or by fax to: +43 1 26007 (no hard copies needed). Copies should be sent by email to the Scientific Secretary of the event, Ms Loreta Stankeviciute, Division of Planning, Information and Knowledge Management, Department of Nuclear Energy (Email: L.Stankeviciute@iaea.org), and to the Administrative Secretary, Ms Valerie Gartner (Email: V.Gartner@iaea.org). The Scientific Secretary of the event will liaise with the participants directly concerning further arrangements, including travel details, as appropriate, once official designations have been received.

Should Governments wish, in addition, to appoint one or more observers to assist and advise the designated participants, they are kindly requested to inform the IAEA of the names and contact details of any such observers by the above date. In accordance with the established rules, Governments are expected to bear the cost of attendance of any observers they may send to IAEA events. Compensation is not payable by the IAEA for any damage to or loss of observers' personal property or for illness, injury or death occurring while travelling to or in connection with their attendance at IAEA events.

Introduction

The workshop will consist of presentations by the participants, experts and group discussions. It will cover: (a) major issues related to energy systems in the context of sustainable development; (b) energy system modelling approaches and scenario designs for evaluating alternative energy strategies that take into account the techno-economic and environmental aspects of various energy option parameters; (c) trade-offs for possible integration of the national energy system with sub regional and regional networks; and (d) the policy relevance of energy system analysis in Member States. The emphasis will be on modelling approaches for the evaluation of energy system infrastructure in relation to energy affordability, energy security, environmental and climate change impacts, with the help of the IAEA's energy models or similar tools.

Each participant is expected to give a presentation with a focus on the application of energy system models in the respective Member States. Of particular interest are innovative analytical solutions to address issues that are likely to be of relevance to other participants. Furthermore, the participants should highlight instances where energy system assessments have been used to inform policy formulation or other decisions in their home countries. A general assessment of how the energy planning and assessment activities are integrated into decision-making processes can also be included in the presentations. A short write-up summarizing the contents of the presentation (e.g. the main model to be discussed) should be sent to the Scientific Secretary of the workshop, Ms Loreta Stankeviciute (Email: L.Stankeviciute@iaea.org) no later than 1 June 2020.

Objectives

The purpose of the workshop is to facilitate the exchange of experiences among Member States regarding the use of the IAEA's tools for energy planning and analysis, and to provide an opportunity to share relevant analytical tools that they themselves have developed. The workshop will focus on methodological aspects of the tools and the relevance they have for the formulation of energy policy and strategies to promote sustainable development in the participating countries.

Target Audience

Member States are invited to designate one participant for this workshop who has specialized knowledge of, or experience in, contemporary energy issues, as well as adequate skills in the use of the IAEA's energy planning models. Each participant is expected to give a presentation lasting 30-45 minutes to share his/her country's experience in analysing energy issues with the help of modelling tools. Member States are strongly encouraged to identify suitable women participants.

Working Language(s)

English

Participation and Registration

All persons wishing to participate in the event have to be designated by an IAEA Member State or should be members of organizations that have been invited to attend.

In order to be designated by an IAEA Member State, participants are requested to send the **Participation** Form (Form A) to their competent national authority (e.g. Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) for onward transmission to the IAEA by 30 April 2020. Participants who are members of an organization invited to attend are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** through their organization to the IAEA by above deadline.

Selected participants will be informed in due course on the procedures to be followed with regard to administrative and financial matters.
